Camper Behaviour & Expectations



Expectations of Campers

- I will be honest, respect myself, others and the environment.
- I will listen, follow directions & rules to ensure everyone is kept safe.
- I will not act violently towards another campers or staff (push, name call, shove, hit, fight).
- I will not use disrespectful conduct or language (name calling, spreading rumours, demean, swear, embarrass).
- I will be responsible for my own actions, attitudes and behaviours.
- I will stay within program boundaries.
- I will play fairly.
- I will do my best to have fun.

Program Expectations

- We will provide choices.
- We will provide an opportunity for each child to participate.
- We will encourage friendship and play.
- We will ensure an opportunity for skill development, and mastery.
- We will provide a caring atmosphere.

We are committed to a safe, inclusive, and fun camp where everyone feels respected and supported.

Conflict Steps

1. Staff will address behaviour, help the camper understand rules and take responsibility for changing behaviour.
2. Supervisory staff will meet with the camper to discuss and implement solutions.
3. Supervisory staff will meet with the caregiver to establish clear objectives for improved behaviour.
4. If further behaviour continues, the camper will be asked to leave camp. If additional situations occur, discussions regarding next steps will take place.
