

THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF GRAVENHURST

BY-LAW NO. 98-97

Being a By-law to Prohibit Littering.

WHEREAS Section 210 of the Municipal Act, R.S.O. 1990, Chapter M.45 provides as follows:

- 210 (82) For prohibiting the throwing, placing, or depositing of refuse or debris on private property or on property of the municipality or any local board thereof without authority from the owner or occupant of such property.

NOW THEREFORE THE COUNCIL OF THE CORPORATION OF THE TOWN OF GRAVENHURST ENACTS AS FOLLOWS:

1. This by-law may be referred to as the "Littering Control By-law"

2. DEFINITIONS

In this by-law:

"Highway" includes a common and public highway, street, avenue, parkway, driveway, square, place, bridge, viaduct, or trestle, any part of which is intended for or used by the general public for the passage of vehicles, and includes the area between the lateral property lines thereof.

"Receptacle" means a container provided for our citizens to be used for depositing wrappers, chip bags, serviettes, cigarette packaging, fast food packaging, etc., but not household garbage.

3. Every person who throws or deposits or causes to be deposited any rubbish, refuse, debris, or litter upon, along or adjacent to a highway, or property of the municipality, or property of any local board, except in receptacles provided for the purpose, is guilty of the offence of littering.
4. Every person who throws or deposits or causes to be deposited any rubbish, refuse, debris or litter upon private property except in receptacles provided for the purpose, is guilty of the offence of littering.

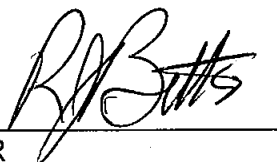
5. Notwithstanding the generalities of sections 3 and 4, no person shall bring and deposit any household garbage in receptacles provided.
6. Notwithstanding sections 3 and 4, no person shall deposit rubbish, refuse, debris or litter without written authority from the owner or occupant of such property.
7. Every person who contravenes any provision of this by-law is guilty of an offence and on conviction is liable to a fine as provided for in the Provincial Offences Act.

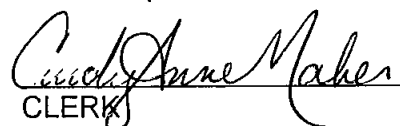
