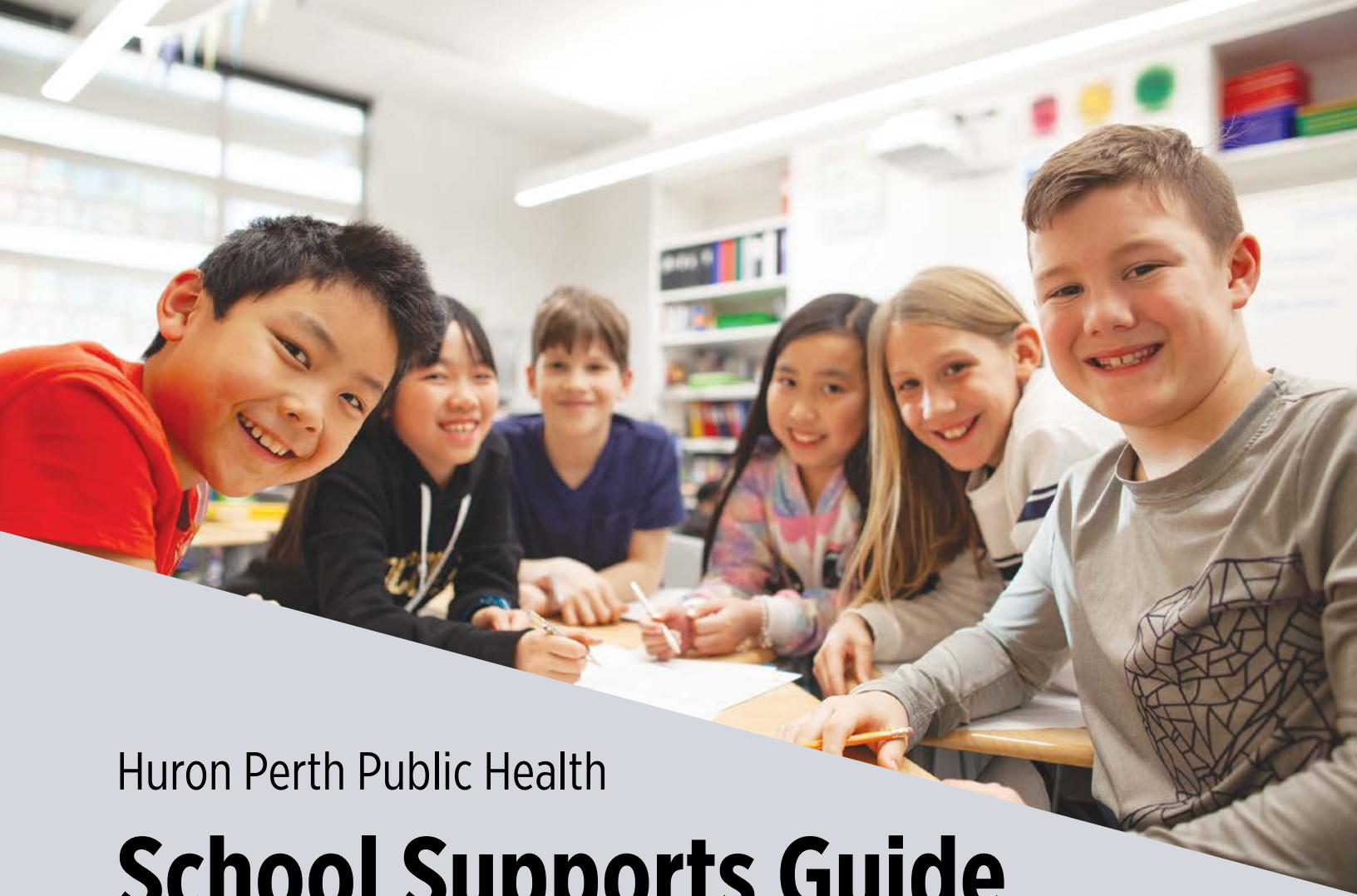

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Who is this guide for?

Huron Perth Public Health (HPPH) offers a variety of resources, supports, and services to schools to promote the health and well-being of students and the school community.

This Guide is for school administrators and staff who need easy access to information on local public health supports relevant to schools, including contact information for HPPH teams.

Animal bites and scratches

HPPH offers support with:

- Investigating animal bites that happen at school.

We would like you to know that:

- Schools are required to report all animal bites and potential rabies exposures (including contact with bats) to HPPH for investigation.
- If a student is bitten or scratched by an animal, the principal should contact HPPH immediately.

Dental screening

HPPH offers support with:

- Dental screenings by a registered dental hygienist for students in JK, SK, grades two, four and seven.

We would like you to know that:

- The oral health team has scheduled all school screening days for 2026-27. ***Check the provided schedule to see your school's screening date.*** If your screening date needs to be changed (e.g., due to a snow day), follow up with the oral health team.
- Schools will be provided with the following documents prior to screening day:
 1. **Instructions for Principal and School Administration**, outlining what is needed from the school for HPPH's dental screening visit; and,
 2. **Parent/Guardian Notification Letter**, outlining what dental screening is, when it is taking place, and an opportunity to opt out. This is sent 10 days prior to school screening.
- After students are screened, they will be given take-home information about the screening and whether the child needs further examination or assessment.

Food handler training and education

We would like you to know that:

- If a school nutrition program is offering more than pre-packaged food, they need at least one volunteer who is a certified food handler at the location when the food is prepared.
- The Safe Food Handling Training Course for Student Nutrition Programs was developed by the Ministry of Health for volunteers supporting breakfast, morning meals, and lunch programs. Those who are interested in the training can register on the [Student Nutrition Ontario](#) website.

Food premises inspections

HPPH offers support with:

- Conducting inspections of school kitchens, cafeterias, before and after-school programs, and student nutrition programs.

We would like you to know that:

- Inspections are conducted one to three times per year to ensure compliance with O. Reg 493/17: Food Premises.
- Inspections assess risks related to food safety, and infection prevention and control.

Head lice

HPPH offers support with:

- Educational head lice resources for parents.

We would like you to know that:

- HPPH nurses do not go into schools to provide head lice and nit assessments or treatment services.
- Head lice resources, including information on how to identify and treat head lice can be found on our [Educators](#) webpage.
- Some head lice treatments are free (covered by OHIP+) for anyone aged 24 years or younger who is not covered by a private plan. Parents/guardians can talk to their healthcare provider or pharmacist for more information.

Health promotion and curriculum supports

HPPH offers support with:

- Consultation on health promotion topics for students, staff, and schools.
- Curriculum resources for educators on a variety of health promotion topics:
 - Food and nutrition (e.g., food literacy, food neutrality, body image)
 - Healthy lifestyles (e.g., physical activity, sleep, sedentary behaviour, outdoor learning, active transportation)

- Healthy relationships (e.g., social skills, peer relationships)
 - Mental well-being (e.g., school connectedness, mental health literacy)
 - Safe and healthy digital technology use
 - Substance use and harm reduction (e.g., smoking, vaping, cannabis)
 - Sun safety.

We would like you to know that:

- Educators can contact the school health program with health-related questions or concerns for their schools and/or students. We may be able to provide information, resources or connect you with another organization/service. (Note: this does not include consultation on individual student needs, e.g., behaviour, mental health concerns).

Illness and reportable diseases

HPPH offers support with:

- Reportable and non-reportable infectious diseases.
- Preventing the spread of illness.

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We would like you to know that:

- Schools are legally required to report any suspected or confirmed cases of Diseases of Public Health Significance (DOPHS) to HPPH promptly. Some DOPHS must be reported immediately, and some can be reported the next business day.
- Details on what and how to report can be found on our [Diseases Reportable to Public Health](#) webpage. A printable version of the DOPHS list can be found at the bottom of that webpage.
- Schools should report illness-related absenteeism that is higher than what the school would typically expect. HPPH will monitor absenteeism rates to identify potential communicable disease outbreaks in Huron Perth. ***If absenteeism related to illness is higher than expected in your school, please complete the online Illness Absenteeism Reporting Form***

Immunizations

HPPH offers support with:

- School-based immunization clinics for Grade 7 students from September to November and April to May (Hepatitis B, Human Papillomavirus Virus, Meningococcal).
- School-based immunization clinics for high school students in November (Tetanus, Diphtheria, Acellular Pertussis).
- Inquiries related to required immunizations under the *Immunization of School Pupils Act*.

We would like you to know that:

- The immunization team has scheduled all school immunization clinics for 2026-27. ***check the provided schedule to see your school's clinic dates.*** If your clinic date needs to be changed (e.g., due to a snow day), follow up with the immunization team.
- The 2026-27 suspension date for school students with incomplete immunization records is March 9, 2027.** More information will be provided in a separate communication.
- Parents/guardians should be advised to submit their child(ren)'s immunization records directly to HPPH. Records can be submitted online at www.hpph.ca/icon, by email, or by fax.

ISPA review and suspension timelines

Action	Timeline
HPPH will mail letters to families with no information on file	Week of September 14, 2026
HPPH will mail 1st notice to elementary students missing immunization information and HPPH will mail 1st notice to secondary students along with Tdap/MenC-ACYW consent forms for clinics	Week of November 9, 2026
HPPH will mail 2nd notice to all students still outstanding for immunization information	Week of January 4, 2027
HPPH to confirm school contacts and send communication about suspension plans	Early January 2027
HPPH will mail suspension orders to students who remain outstanding for immunizations or appropriate paperwork to be completed	Week of February 1, 2027
HPPH will provide a list of all students on the suspension list to school	Week of February 8, 2027
Suspension day - Formal date that the suspension orders are applied. Remaining students are not to attend school.	March 9, 2027
Last day of suspension Students can return to school	April 14, 2027 April 15, 2027

Sexual health and human development

HPPH offers support with:

- Educational resources on puberty, hygiene, and body image.
- Classroom presentations on sexual health-related topics (sexually transmitted infections, birth control, and Q&A) for Grades 7 to 12.
- Education and promotion during specific weeks and school events.
- Access to condoms upon request by schools.

We would like you to know that:

- Puberty, hygiene, and body image resources can be found on our [Human Development and Sexual Health](#) webpage.
- If a student in Grade 7 to 12 requires sexual health or harm reduction services but is unable to attend an HPPH clinic, arrangements can be made for an HPPH nurse to go to the school, based on available space and our

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assessment of need. Services include access to birth control and emergency contraception, STI testing and treatment, pregnancy testing and options counselling for unintended pregnancy, and access to naloxone.

Smoking and vaping incident reporting and signage

HPPH offers support with:

- Ensuring compliance with the [Smoke-Free Ontario Act, 2017](#) (SFOA), including conducting annual inspections within secondary schools, and provision of SFOA signage.
- Applying a progressive enforcement approach to SFOA infractions such as vaping on school property.

We would like you to know that:

- Student SFOA infractions can be reported to HPPH's tobacco enforcement officer by completing our online [Smoke-Free Ontario Act School Incident Report Form](#). If you need a copy of the information submitted, print a copy prior to submitting the form to HPPH.
- Elementary schools can request updated Smoke-Free Ontario signage by emailing tobacco@hp-ph.ca.
- Secondary schools are required to have a *Smoke-Free Ontario Act* inspection annually, usually in August or September. The inspection focuses on identifying missing and required signage for the school, which is provided by HPPH. The tobacco enforcement officer will inform the school administration when they arrive at the school to complete their inspection.

Tick bites

We would like you to know that:

- Finding and removing ticks early is important. see, [How to properly remove a tick from the Public Health Agency of Canada](#).
- In the event a student is bitten by a tick, after removing the tick, contact the student's parent/guardian. Advise them to take a picture of the tick and submit to etick.ca for identification and to follow up with a healthcare provider where necessary.

- Vision problems can impact a student's ability to learn and participate in school activities. Annual eye exams by an optometrist are covered by OHIP for children and youth until 20 years of age. JK and SK students who need glasses can get a free pair through an optometrist participating in the **Eye See...Eye Learn** program.
