2026 TAX PAYMENTS

A reminder for ratepayers that the 2026 property tax deadline of **July 31** has now passed. If your 2026 property tax remains outstanding, a 6% penalty has been applied. To avoid further penalties, please remit payment as soon as possible. Payment can be made online at most financial institutions or in person at the County office. We accept credit cards, debit, and cheques. Office hours are Mon. - Fri., 8:15 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.

NON-POTABLE WATER AVAILABLE AT KSITUAN & BONANZA

Residents and contractors can now access free non-potable water at both the Ksituan Water Treatment Plant and the Bonanza Water Treatment Plant (TWP 802, RR 123). The Ksituan station has reopened with a larger pump, providing increased water volume and pressure. These stations are intended primarily for agricultural use and are also suitable for dust control, construction, equipment washing, and other non-drinking purposes. Please note: Non-potable water is not safe for human consumption, including drinking, cooking, or personal hygiene. Both stations are available throughout the summer season.

THINK BEFORE YOU FLUSH

Working residents are reminded that toilets are designed for human waste and toilet paper only. Wipes, even those labelled "flushable," along with feminine hygiene products, paper towels, cotton swabs, dental floss, grease, and medications can clog sewer lines, damage equipment, and lead to costly repairs. Putting these items in the garbage helps protect the wastewater system and keeps maintenance costs down for everyone.

PROJECT AURORA UNDERWAY

Construction crews and utility locates along local highways and County roads are part of Project Aurora, bringing high-speed fiber internet to Saddle Hills County. Please slow down and obey all construction signage to keep workers and motorists safe.
